Palmer holding research study on "Chiropractic for Hypertension in Patients"—CHiP

The Palmer Research Clinic is seeking individuals ages 21-75 with high blood pressure to participate in CHiP. The Research Clinic, part of the Palmer Center for Chiropractic Research, is conducting this study in collaboration with Trinity at Terrace Park Family Practice Clinic, Bettendorf, and Mount Sinai Medical Center, Miami, Fla.

Eligible participants will be randomly assigned to one of three different groups, all of which will receive chiropractic care

at the Clinic and have their blood pressure monitored at Trinity for eight weeks. All procedures and services are provided at no cost to patients and are delivered by licensed, experienced doctors. Anyone interested in participating should call (563) 884-5188.

Early Alert Response System (EARS) is designed to positively impact each student's experience by identifying challenges early and before they become a hindrance. Information shared through EARS does not become part of a student's record, and any intervention that may be implemented is not disciplinary in nature. However, EARS is not the method for reporting behavior presenting imminent danger.
