At Palmer College of Chiropractic, every number tells a story of student success.

The National Board of Chiropractic Examiners licensure-exam pass rate is a key number. The national exam has four parts. All four parts must be passed within six months of graduation from an accredited chiropractic-education institution. Historically, Palmer College graduates have consistently scored above the national average.

Check this out: 91% of Palmer students pass the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners licensure exams within six months of graduation – that's higher than the national average!

From our leading licensure-exam pass rates, to our hands-on training with more than 126,000 patient visits each year, we give students the tools, experience and support they need to excel.



Force Sensing Table Technology was introduced at Palmer's Main Campus, with plans to introduce the technology at Palmer Florida in the future.

FSTT® allows students to practice thrust pressure on mannequins, and real-time data allows faculty members to illustrate the student's force profile.

Instructors can now provide more individualized feedback to improve adjusting preload, adjusting speed, and modification of pressure for larger or smaller patients. This is yet another way Palmer continues to incorporate cutting-edge technology into our hands-on curriculum.

Palmer Center for Business Development:

Preparing students for the business of chiropractic

The Palmer Center for Business Development hosted more than 20 business-education programs on each of Palmer's two campuses, offering topics including Creating a Business Plan, Loans and Financing, Malpractice and Other Insurances, What to Know About Acquiring Business Real Estate, What to Look for in Contracts, Adapting Al into Your Practice, Marketing Your Practice and more.

The Palmer Center for Business Development complements Palmer's business curriculum, providing students with additional business training at no extra cost. In addition to business training, the Career Development Coordinators at Palmer's Main Campus and Palmer Florida help students with career preparation, including developing resumes and cover letters, LinkedIn profiles, and coaching them with networking strategies.

The Palmer CareerNetwork continues to be a valuable tool for both students and alumni. Last year, 3,599 jobs were posted to the Palmer CareerNetwork, serving as a source for alumni to find graduates to associate or purchase a practice, and for students to find jobs.



Palmer College of Chiropractic meets current and future student needs with campus realignment





In 2022, the Palmer College of Chiropractic Board of Trustees voted unanimously to phase out the College's West campus located in San Jose, California. After thoughtful consideration, and as a proactive business decision, the campus ceased operations in June 2025 when its building lease expired.

"The most strategic higher-education institutions constantly evaluate changing business environments to increase the value of their degrees," said Trevor V. Ireland, D.C., chairperson of the Palmer College Board of Trustees. "They review who they serve and make smart, proactive decisions focused on strengthening their institutions and wisely investing their resources."

Palmer West students were given the opportunity to finish their degrees at Palmer West through March 2025. Eligible students also had the option to attend Palmer's Main Campus or Palmer Florida. The final Palmer West graduation was held in March 2025.

"A culmination of challenges, including the escalation of the building lease, the high cost of living, the employment market, and the College's cost to deliver the program in California compelled the decision to phase out the West campus," said Ireland. "This difficult decision was made after thorough due diligence."

"Palmer College leads the chiropractic profession and sets the standard for real-world preparation for successful careers in chiropractic," said Dennis Marchiori, D.C., Ph.D., Palmer College Chancellor and CEO. "We're confident the needs of current and future students are best served by focusing on the unparalleled opportunities that exist on Palmer's Main and Florida campuses."

Palmer College's Advancement program received multiple awards in 2024 and 2025.






Referrers by the numbers







Palmer Chiropractic Clinics in the community

Throughout the year, Palmer Chiropractic Clinics provided students opportunities to extend their learning beyond the classroom. Through outreach activities, promotional events, and athletic partnerships, students reinforced their clinical skills while developing interpersonal and marketing skills to prepare them for their own practice.

The Palmer Florida Clinic continued to grow its network of community partnerships. Monthly lectures hosted at the Port Orange Family YMCA helped raise awareness of chiropractic care. Clinic faculty and students participated in a variety of athletic events, including the Swamp 360 Mountain Bike Event, Sula Challenge Obstacle Course and the Atlantic Coast Classic CrossFit Competition.

The clinic team also played a vital role in providing care to veterans at the Volusia County and North Florida Homeless & At-Risk Veteran Stand Down. Opportunities to learn the promotional side of chiropractic were conducted at the Port Orange Parks and Recreation Family Days, with the Daytona Tortugas minor league baseball team and at the Pictona at Holly Hill pickleball facility.

In the Quad Cities, Palmer students and faculty continued to make an impact. As the official chiropractic-care provider for the Quad City Storm hockey team, students applied their skills in a sports environment. Faculty and staff also attended local roller derby matches and provided care to members of the QC Rollers.

Palmer Chiropractic Clinics also sponsored the 7th Inning Stretch at every Quad Cities River Bandits baseball game. At every home game the fans followed a series of stretches developed by the Palmer Clinics team while the crowd cam captured all the action.

The annual Quad-City Times Bix 7 tradition continued with Palmer students working alongside faculty to provide care to runners. The iconic Palmer Spine once again walked in the road race — symbolizing our commitment to spinal health and community wellness. Students participating as one of the vertebrae has become one of the "must do"activities while on campus.



Rising preceptorship participation enhances student

clinical experience

Palmer College holds preceptorship agreements with approximately 6,000 chiropractic offices across the country, as well as 50 DoD/VA locations, both of which provide students with robust hands-on training that complement experience gained through the Palmer Chiropractic Clinics.

In these programs, a licensed Doctor of Chiropractic mentors the student in a clinical setting. These programs allow students to refine practical skills, observe the day-to-day business operations and receive guidance on performance.

Designed to complement academic and clinical training, these rotations are a valuable component of students' chiropractic education. Eighty-one percent of students participated in either a preceptorship or DoD/VA rotation this fiscal year.

Doctors of Chiropractic who serve as preceptors make a significant impact. They serve as mentors, providing guidance and feedback on clinical and business aspects of chiropractic as the student transitions into practice.

Dr. Blair Zenker is one of those doctors who proudly hosts student preceptors and shared in the program evaluation form: "Thank you for another wonderful

experience and another student who has been taught chiropractic well. I appreciate the work you and the Palmer administration and staff are doing to better our profession!"
